## **ABOUT THE WEBINAR**

The worth of a civilization can be judged from the position that it gives to women. Since Vedic times, the status of women in Indian society is always considered secondary and substituted to that of male members of society or family. Empowerment would be achieved only when advancement in the conditions of women is accompanied by their ability to influence the direction of social change gained through equal opportunities in economic, social and political spheres of life. It is necessary therefore, to reinforce the rights-based approach for creating an enabling environment in which women can enjoy their rights.

Hindu Succession Amendment Act, 2005 is the reflection of that. With the coming of the Hindu succession act in 2005, daughters got equal rights in their ancestral assets. A coparcener is the one who shares equally in the inheritance of an undivided property. By the way of the Amendment Act, the daughter of a coparcener has been admitted in coparcenaries. The Hindu Succession Amendment Act, 2005 was enacted to enlarge the rights of a daughter, married and unmarried both and to bring her at par with a son or any male member of a joint Hindu family governed by the Mitakshara law. It also sought to bring the female line of descent at an equal level with the male line of descent, including

children of pre deceased daughter of predeceased daughter. The daughter now has the same rights and liabilities in the coparcenary property as the son. Supreme Court pointed out that the said amendment under Hindu Succession Act of 2005 stipulated that a daughter would be a 'coparcener' since birth, and have the 'same rights and liabilities' as a son. This means that a daughter along with a son is liable for debts of joint family. The daughter is also entitled to dispose of her share of the coparcenary property or her interest thereof by way of a will. It has given a huge relief to the daughters to fight with the discrimination on the ground of gender and the consistent oppression and negation of their fundamental right of equality.

This Webinar will focus on Practical Applicability and Social Acceptability of Daughter's Right to property in today's dynamic time.
