

REVISED BACKLOG RULES

As per the decision of Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor on 15/5/2024, Revised Backlog Rules are as under:

A) From Batch 2023-2028 onwards

1. Candidate to be promoted to Second year should not have more than 3 backlog papers in first year. If he/she has more than 3 backlog papers in First year, he/she will be detained. He/she has to join afresh in First year and pursue studies.

2. Candidate to be promoted to Third year should not have any backlogs in First year papers and not more than three papers in the Second year. Otherwise, he/she will be detained in Second year.

3. Candidate to be promoted to Fourth year should not have any backlogs in the second year papers and not more than three papers in the Third year. Otherwise he/she will be detained in Third year.

4. Candidate to be promoted to Fifth year should not have any backlogs in the Third year papers and not more than three papers in the Fourth year. Otherwise he/she will be detained in Fourth year.

However, if a student has been allowed to take repeat examination(s), he/she may be provisionally registered for the next higher session. In case, he/she fails to meet the requirement of the Rule (6) ("A student must secure at least Grade D (Grade Point=5.5) in individual subject and in aggregate to pass"), as a result of the repeat examination(s), his/her registration for the next higher academic session shall automatically stand cancelled. Students, who failed in more than three courses in an academic year, shall seek re-admission to the same class. He/she will be eligible to get a refund of fee of higher academic year as per rules.

All the papers must be cleared within 7 Academic years of joining in the first year in the University.

B) For Batch 2019-2024, 2020-2025, 2021-2026 and 2022-2027

A student shall be required to pass 9 out 12 courses in a given academic year to be promoted to the next Academic year. However, if a student has been allowed to take repeat examination(s), he/she may be provisionally registered for the next higher session. In case, he/she fails to meet the requirement of the Rule (6) ("A student must secure at least Grade D (Grade Point=5.5) in individual subject and in aggregate to pass"), as a result of the repeat examination(s), his/her registration for the next higher academic session shall automatically stand cancelled. Students, who failed in more than three courses in an academic year, shall seek re-admission to the same class. He/she will be eligible to get a refund of fee of higher academic year as per rules.

All the papers must be cleared within 8 Academic years of joining in the first year in the University.
